

Business Risk Identification and Risk Evaluation Workshops

Overview

'Business Risk Management' sounds fine in theory and many companies profess to do it. Who wouldn't want to know what the key risks are to the business - and to know that they're being appropriately managed.

But it's also true that many managers are baffled by the jargon, by the complexity of the processes and by the tools and techniques they're required to learn. Many directors and managers just don't see the benefit for themselves in the Business risk process. This workshop – developed as a follow-on from our IRM 'Business Risk management' course is aimed at demystifying the BRM process in the real world - showing that by 'keeping it simple' (but working to an agreed set of simple rules and procedures) there is demonstrable benefit to be gained in the short term at all levels in the organisation. The workshop has been run for airlines, logistics companies, supermarkets, government agencies, NHS Trusts, Police Forces and a wide variety of other organisations in the UK, Europe and worldwide. If 'keep it simple but make it thorough and effective and achieve results' is the message you want to convey, then this is the workshop to make business risk management come-alive for your organisation.

Aims

- To build on initial Business Risk Management training to support the identification of Key Business Objectives, initial Risk Lists and initial Risk Evaluations
- To enable delegates to identify initial 'Top X' risk lists for Risk Register purposes
- To enable delegates to identify responsibilities and accountabilities for ACTION on key risks
- To enable delegates to identify key initial risk treatment strategies
- To enable delegates to understand and apply basic cost-benefit analysis techniques to risk treatment proposals

Learning objectives

After the workshops delegates will be able to:

- Relate business risks directly to business objectives
- Define & describe risks in meaningful ways to support improved risk communication
- Evaluate risks auditably to agreed risk criteria
- Populate risk registers constructively to support effective action planning
- Quality assure risk assessments made by others
- Develop initial risk treatment action plans for significant risks
- Define responsibility and accountability requirements for effective risk management

Prerequisites

The Workshop is intended solely as a follow-on from our one or two-day Business Risk Management courses. Usually, the workshop is delivered with day 1 as the taught day, day 2 as the workshop. Delegates will benefit from having explored any existing processes, procedures, tools & techniques currently used for BRM within their own organisation prior to attendance.

Who should attend?

Senior, middle and line-managers and other professionals interested in achieving more effective management of risk either at corporate or business unit levels. Human Resource, Project Management, Safety and other professionals wishing to widen their understanding of how to link their own management systems to an overall business risk programme. The workshop is particularly relevant to teams within a company or organisation that want to work together to move their business unit risk management process on, significantly, in one fell swoop!
